"The 2025 Black History Month theme, African Americans, and Labor focuses on the various and profound ways that work and working of all kinds – free and unfree, skilled and unskilled, vocational and voluntary – intersect with the collective experiences of Black people. Indeed, work is at the very center of much of Black history and culture. Be it the traditional agricultural labor of enslaved Africans that fed Low Country colonies, debates among Black educators on the importance of vocational training, self-help strategies, and entrepreneurship in Black communities, or organized labor's role in fighting both economic and social injustice, Black

people's work has been transformational throughout the U.S., Africa, and the Diaspora. The 2025 Black History Month theme, "African Americans and Labor," sets out to highlight and celebrate the potent impact of this work."

Sunday Messages/Sermons for February 2025

February 2, 2025, First Sunday Holy Communion Message; "What More?" Scripture is Matthew 5:17-29 & Leviticus 19:1-4. Did Jesus come to replace or do away with the Commandments of the Old Testament? Did Jesus ever break any of the laws of God? This message will help us answer what Jesus taught in word and deed concerning the Torah and the Commandments.

February 9, 2025, is Boy Scout Sunday. Troop 607 and Pack 3607 will be with us to celebrate this day and take part in our worship celebration. The message for the day is "Essentials of Forgiveness." The Scripture lessons are Psalm 130:1-8, Colossians 3:12-17 and Mark 11:20-25. We know we are told that we are to forgive one another and that forgiveness is one of the marks of being a Christian. This message will detail how to forgive someone and the steps you can take to put forgiveness into action.

February 14, 2025, Valentines Day

February 16, 2025, the message will be "What is Salvation?" Scripture lessons are Titus 2:11-15, Genesis 32:9-12 and Luke 6:6-11. What are we saved from? How are we saved? What does it mean to be saved? What doesn't it mean? Is it important? Why are we saved in the first place? Answers to these questions, plus many more, will be looked at, and answers from the Holy Scriptures will be looked at as we explore "all things of faith" in this important and central message of the Bible.

February 17, 2025 Presidents' Day

February 23, 2025, the message is "Taking Care of Your Mind." Scripture lessons are Deuteronomy 6:4-5 and Luke 10:25-28. We are told that the greatest commandment, in part, is to love God with all of our minds. Taking care of our mind and seeing to its health and fitness is a part of that calling. This message will explore ways of doing such and being able to love the Lord our God with a healthy, vibrant, and faithful mind.
