
May comes and brings us to our 153rd year in Ministry as a Congregation. God is good, and we pray that He will find us faithful as we head into our 154th year.





From Smith Village- Caregivers can build a network of support for caring for those with memory loss

Gain insights and learn practical tips about how to become an empowered caregiver during Smith Village's Caregiver Support Group at 6:30pm on Tuesday, May 20, 2025, at 2320 West 113th Place in Chicago.

During this meeting, Smith Village resident Alice Keane and life enrichment director Bridget Murphy will explore ways caregivers, whose loved ones have dementia or Alzheimer's disease, can take care of themselves. They also will offer guidance about how to build a supportive team and reduce caregiver stress. In addition, Keane will explain how an important, loving relationship may change over time. Both have completed training with the Alzheimer's Association.

"Caregiving is about both giving care and caring for yourself," said Keane. "By adopting a person-centered way of thinking, caregivers make it possible to sustain their essential role."

Murphy added, "We will focus on practical steps to reduce stress and strengthen relationships while caring for a loved one. Our session is full of actionable tips that caregivers can immediately apply to their own life."

This meeting includes videos featuring advice from caregivers and experts, as well as activities to help reduce stress. While those participating are encouraged to share their own experiences, there also is time to ask questions.
