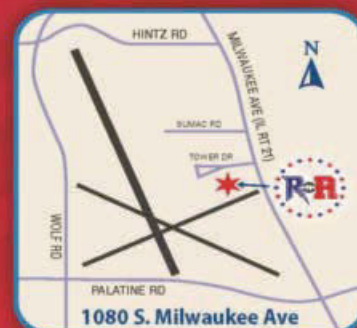

From the Desk of President Horcher

Spring has returned to Wheeling, and I'm happy to report that the Village is already making good use of the year. Most notably, we'll soon be celebrating the grand opening of the new Fire Station 42 on McHenry Road, achieving a longtime goal of establishing a freestanding fire station west of the railroad tracks. Our contractors have begun work on this year's Street Improvement Program—which will resurface approximately 16,000 linear feet of roadway at various locations throughout

Wheeling—as well as the annual Streetlight Replacement Program, which will upgrade 35 old concrete poles in the Ridgely subdivision with new aluminum poles. Thanks to responsible stewardship of our finances and Village staff's hard work in seeking out alternate sources of funding, we've been able to maintain and improve our infrastructure and services without recent increases to our property tax levy.

We're also planning ahead by doing engineering work for upcoming projects, including the replacement of water main on Dundee and Wheeling Roads prior to the resurfacing of Dundee by the Illinois Department of Transportation later this year and the Village's reconstruction of Wheeling Road, tentatively scheduled for 2028. As part of our commitment to effectively managing stormwater, we're making preparations for projects at Ecko Lake and in South Dunhurst. The Village's consistent attention to flood control and its longstanding participation in the Federal Emergency Management's Community Rating System earn Wheeling property owners in designated flood hazard areas a 20 percent reduction in their flood insurance premiums; FEMA recently recertified the Village's status.

When it's appropriate and in our residents' best interests, the Village also finds ways to promote private business activity. We recently updated and expanded the program now called the Wheeling Restaurant, Entertainment, and Retail Build-Out Grant, which reimburses a portion of certain types of improvements to commercial properties in the Village's tax increment financing districts; anchor restaurants, anchor retailers, and entertainment venues will now be incorporated in the program. Wheeling's economy remains robust, with sales tax revenues higher than expected, several new and existing businesses opening and expanding, and mixed-use developments showing notable progress. Most recently, the Village Board granted preliminary approvals to Forest View LLC, which seeks to redevelop the former Solex office building at Dundee and Milwaukee as a mixed-use project, with commercial space on the ground floor and 55 residential rental units above. We'll provide updates on this and other projects as appropriate.



Members of the Wheeling Village Board and Plan Commission celebrated at a ribbon-cutting for a new showroom at Wheeling business DTK Stoneworks on March 18.

Finally, I'd like to extend the traditional invitation to join us at this year's Rock 'n' Run the Runway events at Chicago Executive Airport on Saturday, June 29. As in past years, the celebration will start with a morning 5K run followed by an evening of food trucks, live music, fireworks, and children's entertainment, all taking place in the unique environment of the airport, which Wheeling co-owns with the City of Prospect Heights. Please see the cover and page 10 of this newsletter for more information. We hope to see you there!

In closing I'll say that I am deeply proud to be part of a team of elected officials and administrative staff who are united in a commitment to the needs of this community and who are able to work together to serve Wheeling in an exemplary way.

Waste Management Contract

The Village of Wheeling approved a five-year extension contract with Waste Management for the collection of refuse, recycling, and yard waste. *The At Your Door (AYD) Special Collection program that has been included with residential services in the last five years will be discontinued.* Residents are encouraged to contact the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) or Public Works for appropriate disposal information or recycling events.

SWANCC is an intergovernmental agency that focuses on diverting as much material as possible from disposal by recycling, reuse, or other sources of appropriate disposal options. They are a great resource for residents who may need to locate recycling services or disposal for particular items. Residents can visit www.swancc.org for more information.

Effective June 1, 2024, through May 31, 2025, the non-senior single family home rate (including SWANCC fee) will be \$23.13 per month, and senior single family home rate (including SWANCC fee) will be \$18.48 per month. To be eligible for a senior rate, for curbside residents only, please visit the Village's website at www.wheelingil.gov/431/Senior-Discount or contact Public Works at 847.279. 6900.

POLICE & FIRE DEPARTMENTS



Tornado facts:

- Illinois ranks fourth in the United States for the most tornadoes per square mile
- 80 % of tornadoes happen during the day
- Tornadoes have occurred every month of the year at all hours of the day
- It is critical that you monitor the ever-changing weather conditions in Illinois
- Conduct periodic tornado safety drills at home and work
- Maintain an emergency supply kit
- Check the weather forecast before traveling. Postpone plans if severe weather is imminent.



TORNADO WATCH: BE PREPARED!

Tornadoes are possible in and near the watch area. Review and discuss your emergency plans and check supplies and your safe room. Be ready to act quickly if a warning is issued or you suspect a tornado is approaching. Acting early helps to save lives! Watches are issued by the [Storm Prediction Center](#) for counties where tornadoes may occur. The watch area is typically large, covering numerous counties or even states.

TORNADO WARNING: TAKE ACTION!

A tornado has been sighted or indicated by weather radar. There is imminent danger to life and property. Move to an interior room on the lowest floor of a sturdy building. Avoid windows. If in a mobile home, a vehicle, or outdoors, move to the closest substantial shelter and protect yourself from flying debris. Warnings are issued by your [local forecast office](#). Warnings typically encompass a much smaller area (around the size of a city or small county) that may be impacted by a tornado identified by a forecaster on [radar](#) or by a [trained spotter](#)/law enforcement who is watching the storm.

Storm Planning Timeline

A few days out:

If the forecast calls for severe weather in a few days, start preparing now.

- Make sure you have emergency supplies
- Know your safe places
- Have a family communication plan

The day before:

Forecast accuracy begins to improve.

- Adjust plans
- Make sure you can receive weather alerts multiple ways
- Ensure your shelter is clean and accessible.

The day of:

Remain vigilant and aware of any active watches. A warning may be issued at a moment's notice.

- Remind your family of the communication plan.
- Know how to safely evacuate
- Be prepared to act quickly if a warning is issued

Parking Restrictions in Residential Neighborhoods

It is against Village ordinance to park blocking sidewalks between 6:00 a.m and 10:00 p.m.

The Wheeling Police Department would like to remind you that blocking the sidewalk with a parked vehicle makes it dangerous for people who are walking, pushing strollers, or riding bikes on those sidewalks. This restriction includes recreational vehicles (RVs) for which more specific rules also apply in addition to it being illegal to block the sidewalk (see below). Please help keep the sidewalks clear for pedestrians and bicyclists in Wheeling.



Recreational Vehicles – Parking and Storage

As warmer weather and camping season are upon us, residents who own RVs are reminded that there are limits to when and where these vehicles can be parked. RVs exceeding eight feet in width, 22 feet in length, or ten feet in height must be stored at a residential property only inside an enclosed garage or accessory building; vehicles not exceeding these parameters may also be stored in the rear or side yard of a residential property. RVs may be parked on a driveway for a period not to exceed seven days, and only upon the granting of written permission by the Wheeling Police Department. This permission can be sought from 4 the Police Department a total of four times per year.

Residential Document Destruction Event

On Saturday, May 4, the Village of Wheeling is hosting a combined document destruction and electronic recycling event at Public Works, 77 W. Hintz Road from 9 am to 12 pm only. Delays and longer waiting times are expected during the event. It is recommended that you arrive no later than 11 am to ensure participation.

Residents from Wheeling and other Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) communities are eligible to participate. IDs will be checked for verification of residency. Materials (documents and electronics) will not be accepted from businesses, schools, institutions, or non-SWANCC residents.

To ensure a successful event, please read the requirements below for both documents and electronics. Residents who have not prepared paper documents accordingly, or have materials not included on the list, will not be able to participate.

Document Destruction Requirements

- Accepted documents: bank statements, financial planning statement, medical history forms, retired tax documents, and documents with personal information such as social security numbers.
- Documents not accepted: magazines, junk mail, receipts, ads or coupons, and newspapers.
- Place accepted documents in paper shopping bags or small cardboard boxes.
 - Limit of six (6) paper bags or small (file-sized) boxes.
 - Cardboard boxes will be emptied onsite and returned to residents.
- Paper must be dry, clean, and loose.
- Remove plastic sleeves/spines/covers/binders/folders.
- Remove metal or plastic clips including paper clips and binder clips (small non-heavy-duty staples are okay).
- DO NOT:
 - Place batteries, medications, sharps, household chemicals, or any items containers in document bags or boxes.
 - Bring paper in plastic bags.
 - Include greeting cards, photos, slides, negatives, x-rays, hardcover books, or plastic credit cards or cases from checkbooks.
- Please hold your pet back if you have your window open onsite with staff.

For safety purposes, residents must remain in their vehicle. Residents are not allowed to exit vehicles or stay or park onsite to observe documents being shredded. Please place documents in the trunk and be able to unlock the trunk from inside the vehicle for staff to unload the items from the trunk. Onsite staff will remove documents from vehicle trunks and place them in totes that will be emptied into a shredding truck. Paper will be cross-shredded, baled, and recycled.

Electronic Recycling Requirements

- Accepted items: cable receivers, cell phones, computer monitors, computers (desktops, notebooks, tablets), computer mice, converter boxes, fax machines, keyboards, MP3 players, portable digital assistants (PDAs), printers (multi-function), satellite receivers, scanners, televisions (all types), video game consoles, video recorders/players, zip drives.
- Items not accepted: microwaves, toasters, batteries, blenders, coffee makers, vacuum cleaners, lamps, stereo equipment, speakers, light bulbs, or any other item not included in the accepted list.
 - Items not accepted at the event will be returned to the resident for appropriate disposal.
- A limit of seven (7) items will be accepted per household/vehicle.
- Please hold your pet back if you have your window open onsite with staff.

Household Chemical Waste

Household products such as cleaners, lawn or garden care products, antifreeze, pesticides, etc., can contain hazardous ingredients that can be harmful to human health and the environment, and require proper and safe disposal. Try to purchase limited quantities of household chemical products so that the amount of hazardous waste produced is limited.

Below are facilities available for the disposal of household chemical waste. The Village recommends that residents contact the locations to confirm hours and acceptable materials. Business waste and latex paint are not accepted at any of these facilities.

Latex Paint:

Latex (water-based) paint has a very low level of toxicity, and disposal of latex paint at facilities is very costly. The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) encourages residents with unwanted latex paint to utilize other options.

- Keep painting, or paint something else to use up the paint.
- Donate the paint to schools or local theaters.
- Store it for later use, such as touch-ups. Simply wipe away any excess paint on the outside of the can, place a piece of plastic wrap over the opening, and then replace the lid, firmly sealing it so that the paint doesn't leak. Then turn the paint can upside down; this creates a tight seal and keeps the paint fresh to use again.
- Use an absorbent. Place kitty litter, sawdust, or shredded paper in the can to absorb the paint. When the paint is absorbed, continue to dry the mixture out (with the lid off). When the mixture is completely dried out, secure the lid on the paint can and dispose in refuse containers (not recycling).

Prescription Medications:

The Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County no longer accepts medications for disposal, and therefore the Village has had to cease its monthly collections. Medications can be properly disposed of at many local Walgreens and CVS pharmacies. Sharps collections will still occur the third Saturday of the month at the Wheeling Police Department.

Annual Water Report

The Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) is a document published annually that provides consumers with information about the source and quality of their local drinking water. According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Consumer Confidence Report Rule, every municipal water supplier must provide an annual report by July 1 concerning the previous year's information. The CCR summarizes chemical and bacteriological contaminants, regulation compliances, educational health information, and water system contact information. 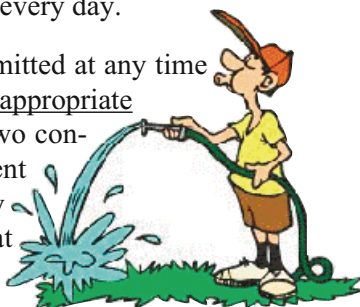

Summer Watering Restrictions

To further water conservation efforts, the Village has implemented an even-odd address watering restriction which is in effect from May 15 through September 15.

- Residents with street addresses that end with an **even number** (0, 2, 4, 6, and 8) can only water on even-numbered calendar days.
- Residents with street addresses that end with an **odd number** (1, 3, 5, 7, and 9) can only water on odd-numbered calendar days.
- Watering is prohibited from 12–6 pm every day.

The watering of newly-laid sod is permitted at any time and on any day upon the issuance of an appropriate permit, and for a time not to exceed two consecutive weeks. Contact the Department of Community Development with any questions about water restrictions at 847.459.2620.



Annual Hydrant Flushing

The Public Works Utility Division will be flushing hydrants throughout the Village through May 15, weather permitting. During this time, hydrant flushing will occur between the hours of 7 am and 3:30 pm and will continue until all portions of the water distribution system have been completed. Signs will be posted throughout the Village while hydrant flushing is underway.



Flushing is an important preventative maintenance process and is undertaken to remove particulate matter and corrosion from the system. Residents may notice slightly lower pressure and discoloration of their water throughout the duration of the program; however, the water will be completely safe to drink. Residents are advised to check the color of the water before beginning laundry to prevent any staining.

Parkway Tree Planting

A Village contractor will be planting parkway trees as part of the spring program during the week of May 13, weather permitting. To maintain a diverse urban forest, a variety of species are selected. The installation process can cause stress to a newly-planted tree, and the recovery rate and establishment ability can vary per species.



If a tree is planted in the parkway next to your property, please follow these guidelines to assist in continued tree growth and smooth transition to its location within the street parkway:

- Watering is a key component to the survival of any newly-planted tree. Each newly-planted parkway tree will receive a slow-release watering bag that holds approximately 15 gallons of water. Filling the bag once a week with water during the first growing season is essential to the tree's ability to establish a healthy root system and overall tree health. Residents are asked to fill these bags weekly until the bags are removed in the fall.

- If mulch is placed at the base of the tree, make sure not to mound the mulch too high against the tree trunk.

- Do not use fertilizers, pesticides, or weed control chemicals to treat the area immediately around the new tree.

- Do not prune the tree.

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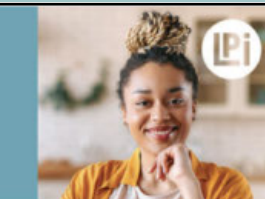


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
