RABBI HONIG'S HEARTFELT HIGHLIGHTS

Rabbi Honig



שיר חדש. Sing to God a new song! Three times we open a chapter of the book of Psalms by not just singing to God but singing a new song. Our sacred texts do not repeat phrases often, so this phrase appearing not only twice, but three times, is telling us something that we ought to seriously take to heart – we need to find ways to make our songs new. How can we sing a “new song” when every Friday night is the same service? I have two ways that I love to do that: new tunes and new intentions.

A new tune can be a great way to make something old new again! Different music evokes different feelings. For example, Psalm 150, “Hallelujah,” can be set to many tunes. The upbeat tune that Ark Adventures uses encourages us to clap our hands or even get up and dance. On the other hand, setting it to Leonard Cohen’s ballad offers a slower moment for reflection or

settling in. The same words with different music become something new.

My other technique is to set new intentions. When I get caught in a tefillah rut, I bring new intentions to my prayers. I particularly enjoy doing so around the brachot of the amidah. Each bracha has a theme and I like to think about my own hopes and prayers for that theme, focusing on that instead of the words on the page. It helps me find new meaning connected to the existing words of the prayer.

I am excited this year to be working to help bring new tunes and new intentions to some of our Friday night services through Ruach Shabbat. Last year, Rabbi Jonathan Bubis launched this service, and I am excited to partner with him to grow it this year. For each Ruach Shabbat, we will have a mix of new and familiar tunes, along with new intentions, to create a space for each of us to find what we need. I hope that you will join us to sing a new song to God this year. Shanah tovah!

FROM THE CONGREGATION PRESIDENT

With the High Holidays approaching, I've been reflecting on the past year, how we've come together in meaningful ways, how much we've built together, and how this experience has shaped me in ways I never expected.

To be honest, I didn't seek a role on the CBS Board of Trustees. It found me. At first, I hesitated when approached by a close friend of mine on the Board, someone I trust deeply. But she said something that resonated with me and reframed my outlook; that leadership isn't always about what we think we want or need. Sometimes, it's about stepping in when the community needs what we have to offer. It's about giving back to the place that has given so much to us. For me, CBS has supported me and my family since the 1960's through every stage of life. This was an opportunity to step in, to bring my skills and my heart to the synagogue that helped shape who I am. My friend sealed her heartfelt pitch, to get me to say "yes" to the Nominating Slate, by adding "*What's in it for you is legacy; sharing the space where your mom gave so much of herself for so many years*". I'd like to believe my mom is watching from above, quietly cheering me on. But it turns out that there was much more in store for me than I could have imagined when I first said yes.

Through my role as your President, I've found myself more deeply connected to Jewish life; not just the structure of it, but the spirit, seeing Jewish values as guides for everyday decisions. I've come to see the synagogue not simply as a place I go, but as something I'm responsible for. I've had to have uncomfortable conversations, make difficult decisions through a Jewish lens, and find strength in collaboration and tradition. It has given me new ways to practice patience, compassion, and humility and affirmed that leadership in a sacred space is as much about listening as it is about leading.

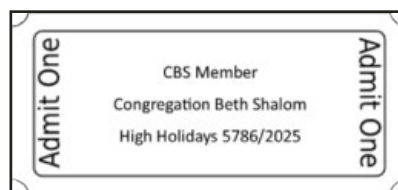
I've come to treasure the small, everyday moments; Shabbat Shalom greetings, our youngest members running to the bimah to gather handfuls of Sunkist Gems after a blessing, the presence of someone saying Kaddish, and the unspoken support we offer each other just by showing up. It's in those moments that I've discovered the true heart of our community, a quiet strength and warmth that holds us all together.

The past year has shown me that leadership at its best is a kind of prayer. It's imperfect and vulnerable, but rooted in love for tradition, for community, and for the people who created the space we now inhabit. If you've been waiting for a moment to get more involved at CBS, let this be it. There is always a place here for your time, your talents, and your presence. As we begin 5786, I hope we can all find ways to connect more deeply to our tradition, to each other, and to the spark of spirituality that lives within us. May this new year bring meaning, connection, and moments of quiet growth for all of us.

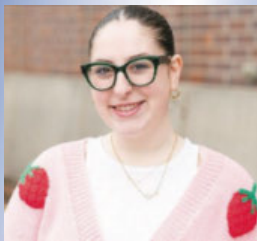

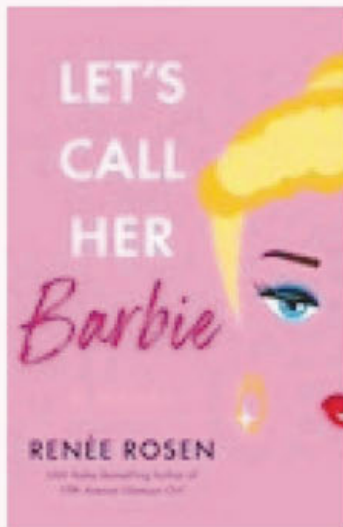

CBS CHEVRE KADDISHE – a SACRED ACT of TRUE KINDNESS



A Chevre Kaddishe, Holy Society, is an assemblage of volunteers who attend to the final ritual preparations for a member of CBS who has passed away. When someone dies there is a prescribed manner of readying the body ritually for burial by means of ceremonious Tahara (washing) and Tachrichim (dressing one in specific articles of clothing). The paramount directive in the entire process is to show reverence for the deceased. One need not be uniquely pious, just someone willing to do his/her best to be part of a Chevre Kaddishe.

Congregation Beth Shalom has such a generous circle of members. Sages have described participation in a Chevre Kaddishe as Chesed Shel Emet, an act of true kindness. This process makes an enormous difference to the deceased's family and creates a renewed perspective, for those engaged in the process, with regard to our own humanity.

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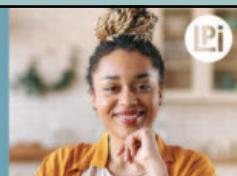

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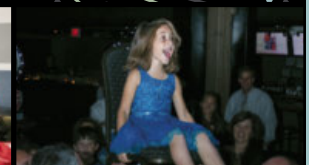
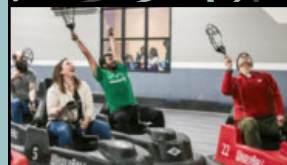
