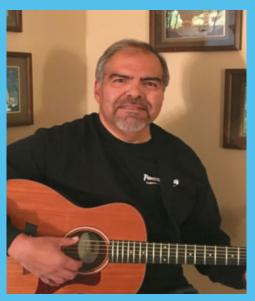




John Solis Music Show Thursday, July 10 at 12:30

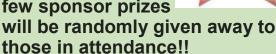

Day/Overnight Trips Policy Information

Participants must be able to travel independently and be self-sufficient. If accompanied by a caregiver, the caregiver must be a paying passenger and follow the same guidelines.

A wait list will be created if a trip fills up before the deadline.

All deposits and payments are non-refundable. A traveler may send a substitute or ask to be replaced by someone from the waiting list, if applicable. If a replacement is found, a refund may be given. Exceptions may be made as determined by the senior center staff for extenuating circumstances. Checks are made out to the Fort Atkinson Senior Center.

Travelers must provide contact information at the time of registration to include date of birth.

Verbal reservations will be accepted, however, payment in full must be received by the registration deadline which is a minimum of 30 days before trip departure. The reservation is not guaranteed until payment is received. Wait list passengers do not pay until they are confirmed to have a spot.

The trip departs from Pick N Save in Fort Atkinson at 8:00 A.M.

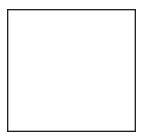
