Since joining the RSVP staff in 1977, she served as the Community Services Coordinator, Assistant Director, Interim Executive Director, and then for the past twelve years as the Executive Director. Margie and the staff at RSVP facilitated other social work student field placements over the years.



She'll continue as a volunteer for RSVP of Dane County after retirement.

Margie has held many leadership positions with national, state, and local organizations. She has served on the National Senior Corps Association (NSCA) Board, Past President of the Wisconsin Senior Corps Association (WISCA), and is currently on the Wisconsin Aging Advocacy Network (WAAN) Board.

Under her leadership, in 2017 RSVP received the Governor's Service Recognition Senior Corps program of the

She shares her talents with many organizations throughout Dane County, but here at RSVP of Dane County, we are beyond thankful to have her on our team of volunteers who affect our community in so many ways. Trudy has been a volunteer at RSVP for nearly 8 years and has spent over 2,500 hours volunteering in the RSVP Group Projects Program making quilts and other items of warmth that are donated to those in need in the community.


