


Cover Art







How do I dispose of needles or lancets (such as used with diabetic persons or animals)? Sharps (ex. insulin needles, lancets, etc.) are essential to the ongoing athome care of many people and pets. Once these items are used, it is unsafe to just throw them in the trash. Sharps collection is offered at the Duxbury Fire Station, free of charge during normal business hours. Sharps must be delivered in a clearly marked, sealed, hard plastic container.

Do you need to dispose of medication? The Prescription Drug Drop Box is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and is located in the main lobby of the Duxbury Police Station. The Prescription Drug Drop Box does not accept liquids or needles. Please drop off needles to the Duxbury Fire Department and contact the Duxbury Health Department to dispose of liquids.

Veterans' News June, 2023

History: June 6th D-Day, Allied invasion of Europe (1944); June 14th the U.S. Army founded (1775); June 22nd the Pledge of Allegiance recognized by Congress (1942); GI Bill signed into law same day (1944); on the 25th the Korean War began (1950); Post 9/11 GI Bill signed into law on the 30th (2008).

If you attended town meeting in March, then you know that I have submitted my resignation as your Veterans' Service Officer effective June 30, 2023. This February I turned 80 years young. After acting as your VSO for the past 13 years, it is time for a



change. It has been my honor to serve the Veterans of Duxbury. We are a shrinking breed. When I started this position in 2010, we had over 900 Veterans living in town. Today our number is in the low 600's, about 4% of the town population. We have lost almost all WWII Veterans, with only a dozen still living in their late 90's. Next, we have a large Veteran population from the Korean and Vietnam era, due to the draft that was in place at that time. By the end of the decade we will be in the 400's.

It is with mixed feelings that I now move to a different phase of my life. Who knows what will come. During my VSO tenure, if you had a question or issue about the benefits you had earned because of your service and sacrifice and you came to me for help, I hope I provided you with clear direction to answers and benefits you so deservedly earned.

I would like to thank the men and women of Duxbury American Legion Post 223 who selfishly helped me communicate, support and participate in various activities I conducted during my tenure. I am a proud member.

Duxbury has posted my position and conducted interviews with 4 applicants. I recommended that two town Veterans be included in the interview process. I encouraged them to consider a Veteran who served in the Middle East wars as the next VSO. This group of Veterans will be the next large group who will need services and access to benefits. Duxbury has selected Sara Lansing as the new VSO. In 2003 Sara served in Iraq during the Gulf wars. She is a qualified VSO and ready to assume her duties on July 1st. I live in town and hope to see many of you in the future.

Thank you for your support over the years. As a Navy Veteran, I extend to you fair winds and following season your path of life. God bless.
