Elizabeth and I are working on plans for the summer....ways to stay connected and have fun after the Grand Finale on Wednesday, June 28th. We will of course give you all the details in the NEXT Encore....but for now, just plan on some summer fun!

While we're gearing up to slow down a bit this summer, I want to challenge you in several ways:

- 1. <u>Bring a friend!</u> We have two FREE lunches coming up in May and June. Why not introduce a friend who might like to engage in some fun, conversation, social connections and a great meal by Lara Pauley. Please make lunch reservations in advance so we can plan accordingly! (See page 4)

What a blessing this would be to the 160 adults living in a "senior shelter" without much heat in the winter. We can get a jump start this summer for the needed 80 men and 80 women stocking caps. If you have yarn and a pattern, great! If you need yarn and a pattern, please let me know.
- 6. <u>Towels & Toiletries</u>: Pastor Chuy from El Regugio in Tijuana (the "Senior Shelter" we learned about in the Mission Focus in March) is in need of towels. They don't have to be new. Gently used, clean towels are great! There's also a great need for toothpaste, shampoo, soap, and shaving cream for the gentlemen. Any of these items can be dropped off at the Senior Center on Wednesdays and we'll happily get them to Lesley and then onto Pastor Chuy at El Refugio. Cleaning out your linen closet (challenge #4) might work beautifully here! I know it will for me!

Lastly, a word about lunch. Please don't let finances keep you (or anyone you know) away! I know finances can be very tight and I don't want the \$8 lunch price to stop anyone from attending. If a reduced rate, or a free lunch is what works in your budget, by all means, come! We've been blessed with grants from both the Kingdom Builder Foundation and Del Mar Healthcare, Inc. to help cover costs such as this. 


KINGDOM BUILDER UPDATE

Kingdom Builder Foundation Celebrates 15 Years

This year, the Kingdom Builder Foundation looks back on its first 15 years of service, a season marked by steady organizational development, increased grant making throughout the world, and rapid increase in the number of "legacy stewards" who've pledged a portion of their estates to the foundation for the purpose of advancing the Good News of Jesus, now and in perpetuity.



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
