

SUMMERTIME TIP

6 TIPS FOR CLEANING UP YOUR EMAIL INBOX OVER THE SUMMER



<u>Hide your email address from public exposure</u> – If you have social media accounts, make sure your email address isn't visible. That way, online scraping programs won't be able to collect your address and sell it for spamming purposes.

<u>Unsubscribe</u> – If you no longer want to receive information from a company or an organization, unsubscribe. Most legitimate email lists offer an unsubscribe option, typically in fine print near the bottom of the message.

<u>Mark as spam</u> – If you've never heard of the company, mark them as spam, and set your email program to block or delete any messages from them.

It's also possible that you ordered something from a company and didn't notice their offer to add you to their mailing list. (Typically, you have to uncheck a small box to decline.) You may feel like they tricked you into signing up, but their messages are not spam. Just unsubscribe.

<u>Set up filters</u> – Most email services include options to create filters that will direct messages from specific senders into a designated folder or to be automatically deleted.

For example, you may want to put all messages from online retailers in a "Shopping" folder. If you aren't sure how to do this, it's easy to find step-by-step instructions by searching online for "How to set up filters on [Outlook, Google Mail etc.]."

<u>Create a disposable or junk email account</u> – It's easy to set up a free email account (think Yahoo or Gmail) to use exclusively on sites that require an email registration (to download a report, for example). You can sign into this email account when you need to "verify" it is a real email address, but ignore it the rest of the time.

There are also disposable and temporary email services that will forward messages to your real email address, but keep your primary address out of spammer's hands.

<u>Start over</u> – If your primary email account is so over-run with spam that you don't WANT to clean it up, you can always use the current address as your "junk" account and set up a new one that's only shared with our most important contacts.

Conclusion

Cleaning out your email inbox can seem tedious and time-consuming; it can admittedly be both of these things if you don't have the proper motivation driving you. Taking a little bit of time to set up weekly reminders, remembering to unsubscribe from newsletters you no longer read, using tags to label emails, and using folders more often can go a long way toward keeping your inbox regularly clean and organized. We hope that the above strategies have been helpful to you as you embark on your summer cleaning.

KINGDOM BUILDER



Announcing Recipients of Spring 2023 Kingdom Builder Foundation Grants



The faithful legacy giving of members and friends of Solana Beach Presbyterian Church has provided over \$1 million in granting to Christ-centered ministries, both locally and globally. Since its founding by SBPC leaders in 2007, Kingdom Builder Foundation has awarded 181 grants for a total of \$1,046,232 in funding. Members and friends of Solana Beach Presbyterian Church support SBPC Ministries and Missions and member-recommended Christ-centered organizations with their tithes, offerings and legacy gifts. Legacy gifts provide two granting cycles each year – in the spring and fall – during which Kingdom Builder Foundation distributes 5% of invested funds to qualified applicants that are either:

- a Solana Beach Presbyterian Church Ministry or Mission; or
- a non-profit organization, which involves an active SBPC Member in leadership or participation, doing Christ-centered ministry aligned with the SBPC Mission and Vision.

This spring, after prayerful review and discernment of numerous qualified applications, Kingdom Builder Foundation awarded \$68,790 in grants. Congratulations to the following 12 grantees for Spring 2023!

Ascending Leaders <u>http://www.ascendingleaders.org/</u> (India) Ascending Leaders coaches churches in the United States and Canada on creating church cultures that are built on discipleship, expanding that work to India in 2021. This grant will provide discipleship culture teaching to churches in India, increasing the number of Indian churches that Ascending Leaders serves from fifteen in 2022 to more than twenty in 2023. Through follow-up work with the existing 15 churches and provides a Pastors Discipleship Workshop for forty more pastors and church leaders with monthly follow up thereafter.

Border Ministries <u>https://solanabeach.church/border-ministries</u> (Rosarito) - Funding for the Rosarito Church Build. This grant provides a down payment for the lot next to the existing project to accommodate a sanctuary large enough to host the growing number of new families. Villa Bonita is a new and vibrant community of young families and a commercial development east of Rosarito. The demand for a church is obvious and the locals have demonstrated their desire to grow closer to Jesus at this site already.

Come Build Hope <u>https://solanabeach.church/come-build-hope</u> (Tijuana) 5 Casas in Tijuana. This grant subsidizes the costs for participants of this short term mission trip which includes the building materials, foundation slab and tools for the casas. SBPC has built over 213 casas in Tijuana and Rosarito Beach Mexico. Volunteer builders will make the trip to Mexico in partnership with Amor Ministry to build 5 homes for families over Memorial Day weekend.

Communitas International <u>http://www.gocommunitas.org/</u> - (France) Support a sabbatical for Justus Heyman after 27 years of full-time ministry. Provides a time for Justus to refocus and renew his life for further service to his current church, Crossroads Church Thoiry <u>http://www.crossroadsthoiry.fr/</u>. The congregation is made up of individuals from over 20 countries living and working in the Geneva area. He will be spending the sabbatical in California, Oregon, and France.

Foundation Matthew 6:33 <u>https://www.foundationmatthew633inc.org/</u> (Escondido) -"Go YeTherefore" is a food delivery pilot project committed to delivering food to approximately 25 homebound seniors and individuals with disabilities in Escondido on a weekly basis in the coming year. This is felt to be a logical extension of the program which distributes food, diapers, and feminine hygiene products to approximately 140 families twice each week.

Generate Hope <u>https://www.generatehope.org/</u> (Coronado) Laptops to Support Programs for Survivors of Sex Trafficking. Purchase of new laptops to support our sheltered care, education rehabilitation, and therapeutic programs for female survivors of sex trafficking in our San Diego Restorative Care Programs. These laptops will specifically support residents in the Transition phase of the program who are pursuing their education and vocational goals.

House of Blessing <u>https://www.houseofblessing.online/</u> (Los Angeles) - Supports Christian Transitional Rehabilitation Housing of at risk women to "Just love the women. Help them know Jesus." This ministry was founded by the mother of an SBPC member in 2012 and is facing significant transition following the founder's death. Funding will help build capacity for sustainability during this time of ministry transition.

Open Road Global <u>https://www.openroadcollaborative.org/</u> (Tijuana) Increase capacity of this ministry which empowers families to live financially secure and dignified lives. Expands current programs in Tijuana refugee shelter to help women break the cycle of poverty, abuse, and violence through skill training, treatment and counseling. Services provided include safe housing, medical treatment, trauma counseling, and life-changing opportunities through sustainable income development.

San Diego Rescue Mission <u>https://www.sdrescue.org/what-we-do/residential-program/</u> (San Diego) - Funding for Faith-Based Rehabilitation Curricula to support the spiritual development of the students in the Mission Academy -- a 12-month, faith based, residential recovery and rehabilitation program for men and women experiencing homelessness.

South American Theological Seminary <u>http://www.satsbrazil.org/ http://www.ftsa.edu.br/</u> (Brazil) Jorge and Denise Barro Grant for Post-Doctorate work at Fuller Theological Seminary Research on *The Mission of God as Paradigm of Pastoral Ministry in the areas of missiology and pastoral ministry for a book to help other pastors in Brazil.*

Wellness Ministry <u>https://solanabeach.church/wellness-ministry</u> (Solana Beach) Creates a sensory room for children and families at Solana Beach Presbyterian Church. This room will provide a space where children ages 3-14 can go to calm themselves or satiate a need for excess stimulation. This impacts the children that utilize the room, teachers, staff and volunteers, as well as parents who are able to participate in programs instead of being called out to assist with their child(ren).

Worship and the Arts 2023 Choir Tour <u>https://solanabeach.church/choir-concert</u> (Southern/Central California). "Kingdom Come" sing & serve Choir Tour 2023 aims to glorify God through uplifting music, hands-on service projects serving the hungry and homeless, and intentional personal connection with others. The choir tour includes concerts in retirement homes in Glendale and Pasadena, and singing with the First Presbyterian of Bakersfield choir for a Saturday concert and Sunday worship service.

In addition to tithes and offerings, legacy giving through the Kingdom Builder Foundation is another way members and friends of Solana Beach Presbyterian Church enter into where God is at work both locally and around the world. September Discussion ~ Lessons in Chemistry by Bonnie Garmus

NATIONAL BESTSELLER #1 NEW YORK TIMES BESTSELLER A delight for readers of Where'd You Go, Bernadette, this blockbuster debut set in 1960s California features the singular voice of Elizabeth Zott, a scientist whose career takes a detour when she becomes the star of a beloved TV cooking show.

Chemist Elizabeth Zott is not your average woman. In fact, Elizabeth Zott would be the first to point out that there is no such thing as an average woman. But it's the early 1960s and her allmale team at Hastings Research Institute takes a very unscientific view of equality. Except for one: Calvin Evans, the lonely, brilliant, Nobel Prize–nominated grudge holder who falls in love with—of all things—her mind. True chemistry results.

Like science, though, life is unpredictable. Which is why a few years later Eizabeth Zott finds herself not only a single mother but also the reluctant star of America's most beloved cooking show, Supper at Six. Elizabeth's unusual approach to cooking ("combine one tablespoon acetic acid with a pinch of sodium chloride") proves revolutionary. But as her following grows, not everyone is happy. Because, as it turns out, Elizabeth Zott isn't just teaching women how to cook. She's daring them to change the status quo. Laugh-out-loud funny, shrewdly observant and studded with a dazzling cast of supporting characters, *Lessons in Chemistry* is as original and vibrant as its protagonist.
