CARFIT - Custom Driving Safety Program

To help older drivers over the age of 55 remain mobile, Scripps Health Trauma Injury Prevention Team and the Solana Beach Community Senior Center located at Solana Beach Presbyterian Church will host a **CarFit** event.

CarFit was designed to help older drivers learn how the effects of aging can change the way they fit in their vehicle and how their driving can be affected.

CarFit is a FREE, interactive and educational program designed to improve older driver safety. A 15-minute in-person appointment with a certified CarFit technician will provide information ensuring the safest "fit" for drivers and their vehicles.

CarFit's 12-point checklist on the driver and the car includes evaluating:

- Seat-belt adjustment
- Car pedals
- Seat and steering wheel positioning
- Visibility through windows and mirrors

Often after adjusting these vehicle components, drivers report feeling safer and more comfortable. Also, participants will learn how to better maintain and strengthen their driving skills.

All drivers who attend will receive a free resource bag filled with informative goodies and places to go for further evaluation.

In Kristin Hannah's *The Women*, Frankie McGrath is a young woman from a wealthy family who decides to enlist as a nurse in the Vietnam War after her older brother is killed in action.

In doing so, she leaves her sheltered and comfortable life in California to serve in a warravaged country working under dangerous conditions. When she returns, the atmosphere in America is hostile to veterans, dismissive of women's contributions in the war and she struggles to reassimilate.

In a story about patriotism, friendship, remembrance and defying expectations, *The Women* tells an often-overlooked story of the courageous women who served in Vietnam.

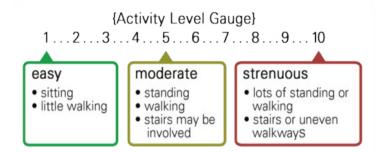
Be reminded, even though the Senior Center will not offer many of the same regular activities, it is still super important for you to stay connected and active.
