My Daddy, my hero.....he was an avid outdoorsman. Hunting, fishing, flying, skiing-both snow and water, underwater photography and running. There were so many activities he loved to do it was hard to keep up with him. He is known to his kids as Pops or Daddy and to his grandchildren and great grands as simply Grandfather. Though never a man of many words it started becoming apparent that Daddy was changing.

He and mom still lived in the house they'd been in for over 4 decades and he was doing fairly well. Mom was caring for him and for the most part they were ok. Then Covid happened and they were like most of the elderly population of the world, they closed their doors and hid from the virus.

For nearly 3 years Daddy remained in the house leaving only for necessary appointments and a few special outings. During this time, we, the kids, could see changes taking place in both of our parents. Mom's physical health was declining while Daddy's mental health was really sliding. He was showing all the symptoms of memory loss.

My once vibrant, active father was now spending his days sitting in his recliner looking out the window watching the birds. Music was the only thing that touched his heart. While he would exercise, going for short walks and using their exercise machine, he was becoming more and more frail right in front of our eyes.

His memory loss has become so profound that 6 months after losing his beloved wife of 67 years he had forgotten her. He is now living a happy life in Texas where I visit him as often as possible. He doesn't quite know me anymore however he always smiles when I walk in the room and that's enough for me.



News from our Gardener

April and being outside in the fresh air, soaking up the sunshine is known to be an effective way to boost your mood and do a little distressing.

Wait, You think it's cold out there. The soil temperatures are still in the 40's, water temperatures are closer to the 30's and seedlings and plants seek and need that elusive sun to create the miracle of photosynthesis; What's a gardener to do? My data (Dept of Vegetable Crops, U of CA at Davis, shows there are a few seeds such as peas, spinach, parsnips, onions and lettuce that will germinate in this environment, but even these cool weather crops will take in excess of 30 days before you'll ever see sprouts in an open garden. Yes, I do start seeds indoors, but at this time of year I'm all about investing time and effort to create healthy soil to support my plants through the real growing season. Let's get started by reviewing some easy steps to help your soil in the coming year.

First, to build healthy soil you must get to know your soil; it's just not dirt or in the case of the land I live with, it's just not rocks (glacier till). Sure, there are plenty of minerals but you also need organic matter, air, water and living organisms. The people who study this write that there are over 1 billion organisms in one gram of healthy soil. These creatures, part of the food chain, are busy at work breaking down that organic matter to release the energy that plants will take up. Pesticides kill these organisms! Think twice before applying pesticides and while you're thinking, read and follow the instructions for pesticide use. Air and water provide the plants with carbon, hydrogen and oxygen which are the growing blocks that most living tissue needs. Knowing your soil takes digging in and looking for thatch, compaction or larva that may be detrimental to your soil's function. A soil test assures me that the fertilizers and amendments that the local stores want to sell me are actually needed. For our area, I test my soil for PH factors each year but otherwise I'll do a complete test maybe every three years.

Second, add compost. If your planting a new garden or lawn, 2-3 inches of compost dug in to 4 inches of native soil will be adequate. Then each year after, an inch of compost for gardens and half an inch for lawns, will keep those micro nutrient levels and organisms at peak performance. We are so lucky to have compost available to us for free or at a small fee from our local recyclables centers. I want you to know that product like Tagro or Soundgrow are biosoils that have been tested and are safe and weed seed free. You will not find that in the manures or your own compost bin. Tagro or Soundgrow sounds good but know that compost is part of not the same as soil.

Third, apply mulch. Mulches limit soil erosion, reduce water evaporation, keep weeds from populating those bare areas, and reduce fluctuations in our soil temperature. What is mulch? Woody waste products (untreated) are a mulch and are also free from your local tree service. Compost is a mulch but most compost is know to have a high nitrogen content which makes compost a good companion to use under wood chips as the chips use nitrogen to break down. Let's grow!

Lots of work to do at the Center's gardens; join in with Linda or I anytime to help out.
