The Board holds their meetings on the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 3:00 pm.





#### **Lunch Service**

Effective January 1, 2025 we will no longer be able to deliver lunches to house-bound seniors due to budget cuts. If you have a need for delivered meals, please contact Lutheran Community Services NW at 206-901-1685 or Catholic Community Services at 206-328-5696.

We have 2 types of lunch service, "To-Go" service which begins at 11:30 (you must come inside to pick up your meals) and "Dine-in" service which begins at 12:00pm. Please fill out, (don't forget to put your name on it) and turn in your order-ahead menu for "to-go" lunches only or call in by 10am the morning of pickup. (located on page 5).

### FOUR SIGNS THAT IT'S A SCAM

#### 1. Scammers PRETEND to be from an organization you know.

Scammers often pretend to be contacting you on behalf of the government. They might use a real name, like the FTC, Social Security Administration, IRS, or Medicare, or make up a name that sounds official. Some pretend to be from a business you know, like a utility company, a tech company, or even a charity asking for donations. They use technology to change the phone number that appears on your caller ID. So the name and number you see might not be real.

#### 2. Scammers say there's a PROBLEM or a PRIZE.

They might say you're in trouble with the government. Or you owe money. Or someone in your family had an emergency. Or that there's a virus on your computer. Some scammers say there's a problem with one of your accounts and that you need to verify some information. Others will lie and say you won money in a lottery or sweepstakes but have to pay a fee to get it.

#### 3. Scammers PRESSURE you to act immediately.

Scammers want you to act before you have time to think. If you're on the phone, they might tell you not to hang up so you can't check out their story. They might threaten to arrest you, sue you, take away your driver's or business license, or deport you. They might say your computer is about to be corrupted.

#### 4. Scammers tell you to PAY in a specific way

They often insist that you can only pay by using cryptocurrency, wiring money through a company like MoneyGram or Western Union, using a payment app, or putting money on a gift card and then giving them the numbers on the back of the card. Some will send you a check (that will later turn out to be fake), then tell you to deposit it and send them money.

#### **HOW TO AVOID A SCAM**

Block unwanted calls and text messages. Take steps to block unwanted calls and to filter unwanted text messages. Don't give your personal or financial information in response to a request that you didn't expect. Honest organizations won't call, email, or text to ask for your personal information, like your Social Security, bank account, or credit card numbers. If you get an email or text message from a company you do business with and you think it's real, it's still best not to click on any links. Instead, contact them using a website you know is trustworthy. Or look up their phone number. Don't call a number they gave you or the number from your caller ID. Resist the pressure to act immediately. Honest businesses will give you time to make a decision. Anyone who pressures you to pay or give them your personal information is a scammer. Know how scammers tell you to pay. Never pay someone who insists that you can only pay with cryptocurrency, a wire transfer service like Western Union or MoneyGram, a payment app, or a gift card. And never deposit a check and send money back to someone. Stop and talk to someone you trust. Before you do anything else, tell someone — a friend, a family member, a neighbor — what happened. Talking about it could help you realize it's a scam.







By the first week of November you should have planted your spring flowering bulbs. Bulbs that grow and bloom in the spring are daffodils, tulips, narcissus, hyacinths, bulb irises, crocuses, and snowdrops. Choose bulbs that are firm and solid and have no mold or spots. Large bulbs are usually better than small ones. Read more at WSU publication EM2869E WSU Extension Publications | Growing Flowers from Bulbs.

You can't go wrong with a Thanksgiving cactus if you're looking for early winter color and interest in a house-plant. This houseplant is named after the period it typically flowers making it an essential part of your holiday decor. Don't confuse it with the Christmas cactus, which will flower closer to the December holiday. As long as you time it correctly, you'll enjoy the blooms not only at Thanksgiving dinner but also in the early weeks of winter.

Cyclamens are not majorly popular houseplants for most of the year. However, once winter rolls around, they

truly become the star houseplants of the show. Their adorable blooms, emerging in a range of eye-catching colors, pop up in the middle of winter and stick around until early spring. One of the major benefits of keeping cyclamen in your indoor garden is you can pick a favorite that's perfectly suited to your interior design or start a collection to gather them all. That's certainly my preference.

The last piece of advice I will give you starts with the question: how do you repair a broken jack-o-lantern? That's right' you use a pumpkin patch! With that I'll close with best wishes from the garden committee for the holidays!

# Some Drugs Less Expensive with Medicare

Some people with Medicare could end up spending less money on potentially lifesaving medications through the end of the year.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced that <u>54 drugs available through Medicare</u> <u>Part B</u> will have a lower coinsurance rate between Oct. 1 and Dec. 31, since the prices set by their manufacturers have risen faster than the rate of inflation.

Drugs that fall under Part B are typically administered in a doctor's office or hospital and can include cancer treatments, <u>Alzheimer's treatments</u> and injectable osteoporosis medications.

Under a provision in the AARP-backed prescription drug law passed in 2022, the coinsurance rates for these 54 medications will be 20 percent of what the price would have been if it increased with inflation, which will be less than what the beneficiary would pay otherwise. Drugmakers will also face penalties for the price hikes in the form of a rebate to Medicare, and these funds will be used to help ensure the sustainability of the <u>national health insurance program</u> that provides coverage to more than 67 million Americans who are older or have a disability.

#### Some could see significant savings

More than 822,000 people with Medicare use the 54 selected drugs annually to treat conditions such as cancer, osteoporosis and <u>pneumonia</u>. According to HHS, some people with Medicare taking these medications could see savings in the last quarter of the year that range from \$1 a day to more than \$3,000 a day. How much each person pays for their medications varies, depending on whether they have additional insurance that covers or reduces <u>Part B</u>'s 20 percent coinsurance. The list price for some of these drugs is hundreds of thousands of dollars per treatment. "No one should have to choose between paying for their health care or putting food on the table," HHS Deputy Secretary Andrea Palm said in a news release. "The Inflation Reduction Act is all about bringing down the price of health care and making sure the American people benefit."

The Medicare Prescription Drug Inflation Rebate Program is just one provision under the 2022 law that's aimed at lowering drug prices and related out-of-pocket costs. The law also gives Medicare the <u>power to negotiate</u> <u>lower prices</u> for certain prescription medications. The first batch of negotiations included 10 common and costly medications, and when the lower prices take effect in 2026 they will save people with Medicare prescription drug plans a collective \$1.5 billion in out-of-pocket expenses, health officials project.

"Discouraging price increases above the rate of inflation by drug companies and negotiating lower prices on some of the most expensive and most frequently used drugs in the Medicare program delivers on our promise to bring savings to Medicare enrollees," Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services Administrator Chiquita Brooks-LaSure said in a news release.

Another key provision in the law caps annual out-of-pocket prescription drug expenses at \$2,000 starting Jan. 1. The new limit is expected to <u>benefit nearly 3.2 million older Americans</u> with a Medicare prescription drug plan in 2025, AARP research found. That number will swell to more than 4 million in 2029.
