

The Board holds their meetings on the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 3:00 pm at the Senior Center.





News from our Gardener

I come to back to our PNW. How does that old saying go: May showers ruined my flowers; or something like that for here in the PNW. Let's not dwell; it is June, in like a polar bear and out like a roar. My lettuce and spinach, carrots, cold weather crops are doing just fine and really my flowering bushes are in full glory while taking advantage of our long days. I'm sure what is really taking off is your grass. At the end of May to the beginning of June add nutrients to your soil such as a natural organic or a slow release amendment. Mow higher like 1-2 inches and leave the clippings. Studies show this action does not cause thatch and indeed makes lawns healthier and recycles fertilizers. My wallet and my lawn thrive with the bio-soil that Sumner gives away for free as a fertilizer and by using the rule that lawns only need one inch of water, plus rain, during the summer months, my lawn has really greened up. I like looking at a nice lawn but I see lawns use my resources at a much greater rate than a beautiful bed of adapted native plants. If you need help choosing the plant that is proper to you, see the details and view color photographs from "The Plant List" by visiting www.greatplantpicks.org. They have plant lists that break down the proper plant for your micro-climate and the list is well organized by season with indicators to the plants preference to sun/ shade or deciduous or evergreen. Still lawns are what we have and fighting weeds is what we have to do; try using a long handle weed puller to get you a little workout with your lawn weeds and you will not need to use that weed and feed poison.

When you think about it, pesticides and herbicides are another brand of poison. As a local stream monitor I have seen reports of over 23 pesticides measured in Washington streams. The cause is simple overuse of these products which easily seep down to our water table and spreads to all of us. Think before using pesticides, you want to use the least toxic control method. Know our county has a weed service program which can give you advice on the appropriate use of weed control methods and loner tools with free disposal resources. For more information go to www. PierceCountyWeedBoard.org.

In my garden I start with prevention. Like roses, disease resistant plants are available. Pull weeds or not; I leave plenty for the pollinators to feed on. Take the time to know what your problem is before spray, squash or stomp, most of those bugs are needed in our environment. Also, be willing to accept a little damage; as the weather warms up the predators will be able to help you with pest. When you're faced with that decision on what to do, remember: "All you have to do is act naturally". Learn more about lawns, gardens, pest from Washington State University Extension @Gardening.Edu. Or enjoy a talk on Saturday's at the Master gardeners demonstration garden at the WSU extension

in Puyallup.

Troll Trips with Joy & Kerry

Issaquah Troll Trip

Wednesday, June 18th

Travel to Issaquah and see Jakob Two Trees. Take a nice stroll on a well paved, level path for less than 1/4 mile and see Jakob. Fashioned entirely out of recycled materials, Jakob is large-scale public art installation that tell a tale of protecting nature and honoring the land and waterways. Jakob stands around 14-ft. tall, looking down at passersby who walk near him on the trail. He is the first troll to have a ponytail, with a band made by the Snoqualmie Tribe holding his hair in place. He wears a necklace of birdhouses over his fur, inviting forest creatures to come spend an afternoon with him.

Vashon Island Troll Trip

Unlike his counterparts, Oscar The Bird King boasts distinctive features, including a crown of birdhouses made from wood scraps and leftover materials, underscoring Dambo's commitment to sustainable art. Local residents contributed to Oscar's grandeur by donating strands adorned with natural objects like driftwood, shells, feathers, and stones.

West Seattle Troll Trip

Named Bruunidun ("Idun" for short, pronounced "Eden"), the troll is nestled among the trees playing an enormous flute to call home the native Orcas. Idun is made from recycled and found materials by Danish environmental artist Thomas Dambo (and assembled onsite with a team of local volunteers) as part of his project.
