

The Board holds their meetings on the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 3:00 pm at the Senior Center.







Glenn Cutler, a retired US Navy veteran and resident of Bonney Lake in the Tehaleh, is a certified service officer with the DAV. He has been helping veterans, and their spouses for the past 12 years to obtain compensation and pensions from the US Department of Veteran Affairs.




Special Event refund policy:

Hoping for your garden to do well isn't free. You'll feel disappointment when plantings die because sometimes they will. You'll also have to endure the cynics, smugly insisting that gardening is toomuch work is just them being realistic, even though they're always predicting disaster. And to be sure, false optimism is no better. Only a fool always insists that things will work out, because sometimes they won't. You do want to do what the cynics claim to be doing and be realistic. Gardens have flaws and so do gardeners. Gardening purely through science is out of the home gardeners league so you and nature are like getting along with bad neighbors. So, when you drink your coffee on a busy Sunday and think about who you were, who you are, and who you want to be, you realize you've seen enough to keep some pessimism about gardening but you also don't want to be someone who always expects the worst. Perennials that you **dig up, divide, transplant**, or re-plant in September have plenty of time to establish themselves in the soil and develop root systems before winter temperatures begin to freeze the ground. For perennials that bloom in spring, such as peonies and irises, **autumn is often the preferred time to divide and transplant**.

As for all those falling leaves, well, I hum along with the Green Day tune "Rake me up when September ends." Savor those last sips of summer and enjoy your day.
