
Trip participants are limited to signing up for one trip during the first week of the month. After the first week, participants may sign up for unlimited number of trips.

News from our Gardener

After that beautiful summer; you autumn know that this time of year, brings the need to continue your bulb plantings along with the task of clearing out the used plants. The Senior Center's gardens were blessed with all ages of community gardeners helping our garden shine in that summer light. Now as the gardens slowly dies back, we are still blessed as we become pumpkin spice obsessed. Summer's flings were great, yet summer gives way to this season where you are invited to Fall in love and with all the pumpkins around, autumn is definitely the most gourd-geous season to gather friends together. I know that this sweater weather is always better when friends are together! That's right, fall is simply a-maize-ing. I apologize; After this article, you can say I'm the pun-kin of Fall.

There is still plenty of gardening to do at the Center but we're sure to be carving out some fun at our local farms. Audrey and I take in the changing season with a hay ride, walking through a corn maze or maybe a few tries at mayhem using a large slingshot. That's right you can be slinging pumpkins at a tractor in the field this fall too. Sounds like fun to me and the idea that these events support our local farmers is a giant win-win situation for our community. Longer nights bring cooler nights and dampening off diseases that you see as powdery mildew on those tomatoes and squash leaves. The mildew is fatal and a good sign that the summer growing season has ended. The time has come to bring those houseplants back inside. Because most houseplants are actually tropical plants, they must be brought back inside once night-time temps fall below 50 degrees. Bringing plants inside for winter isn't as easy as simply moving their pots from one place to another; there are a few precautions you need to take when acclimating plants from outdoors to indoors to prevent sending your plant into shock. Most houseplants cannot stand temps below 45 degrees F. (7 C.). It is very important to acclimate your houseplant to the environmental changes from outside to inside. Gradually, over the course of two weeks, increase the amount of time the plant spends indoors . Your houseplants are going to need a bath before relocation as those creatures that live outdoors will be looking to hitchhike to a warmer place too. I like to soak the plant in a water bath with dawn dish soap and then wipe the leaves with a product made of neem oil. The oil gives the plant a polished look and forms a protective barrier from plant diseases.

Outdoors, discontinue deadheading roses so that the plantscan form hips. Hydrangea blooms should be left on those plants as they form a protective shield to ward off snow and freezing temperatures. Now is the time to plant bulbs as the ground is still warm enough to encourage those plants to root. I find these longer nights a good time to take a continuing education class. Free classes are listed on-line or try a Masters course to stimulate yourself. For free advice or just to answer a particular plant question is what master gardeners do so contact the Pierce County Master Gardeners at 253-798-7180 or use extension.wsu.edu.
