FEATURED SENIOR OF THE QUARTER

GARY L. LINDNER

Gary Lindner is a fourth generation descendent of 1853 Michael Lindner family that settled in Comfort. He was born to Robert and Marguerite Lindner on August 2, 1947 and grew up on the family ranch 5 miles southwest of Comfort. He learned how take care of livestock, hard work and honesty early in life. He hauled hay, cut cedar posts, built fences, plowed, fields etc. In summer he worked for the Comfort Wool & Mohair Company, Steves Lumber Yard. In winter he hunted and trapped. Gary attended Comfort Schools and graduated in 1965.

Gary received a Congressional appointment to the U.S. Air Force Academy (USAFA) in 1965 from Congressman O.C. Fisher. He excelled in academics, sports, and military training. He was frequently on the Deans, Commandants, and Superintendents Lists. He graduated in 1969 with a Bachelor of Science degree, commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant and was selected to attend U.S. Air Force (USAF) Undergraduate Pilot Training at Randolph AFB near San Antonio.

It was during Pilot Training that he met the love of his life, Barbara Blaha. After Gary graduated from Pilot Training. they were married December 28, 1970, in Randolph AFB Chapel, and began an adventure that took them all over the U.S. and Europe for 29 years and 22 different addresses. They were blessed with three children Brett, Laura, and Todd (deceased).

Gary served in a series of operational flying assignments that included 872 hours of intense air combat 1971-1973 in Vietnam/Southeast Asia. He was promoted to Colonel and Command Pilot ahead of his peers, and selected for command that included a flying training squadron at Del Rio, TX; the largest Support Group in the U.S at Lackland AFB, and historic Tempelhof Air Base in Berlin Germany. He also had staff assignments at Omaha NE, Norfolk VA, Washington DC, Montgomery AL, and San Antonio TX. During his career he earned the Legion of Merit (3) Distinguished Flying Cross (1) Meritorious Service Medal (4) Air Medal (9) and numerous other awards and decorations. He earned a master's degree from Auburn University in 1979. Gary retired from USAF in 1998 and moved back to Comfort.

From 1998- 2004 Gary was a Senior Vice President for San Antonio Southwest Business Corporation and in his first year he earned the prestigious million dollar round table status for over \$1 million in insurance sales. He transformed a major division to profitability for 5 consecutive years. From 2004-2015 Gary served in senior leadership positions in the non-profit organizations. From 2004-2010, he was Chief Operating Officer of ACCION Texas in San Antonio. With positive leadership he quadrupled the outstanding portfolio

and became the largest microlender in the U.S. In 2010 he was recruited to be President & CEO of PeopleFund in Austin and grew the organization from five county service area to statewide lender that achieved national prominence. He opened 8 new offices and quadrupled loan volume. During his tenure, both he and PeopleFund earned numerous exceptional performance awards.

Gary is fourth generation owner of the Lindner Four L Ranch which has been in continuous agricultural production since 1875. He has been involved in numerous community activities - Chairman Community Foundation of the Texas Hill Country, Chairman Comfort Boys and Girls Club, Commander VFW Post 8569, Co-Chair of highly successful Comfort 150-year Jubilee Celebration, Sacred Heart Catholic Church Pastoral Council President, Secretary/VP Comfort Area Foundation, Treasurer Comfort Cemetery Association, President Comfort Golden Age Center, and Board of numerous national, state, and regional non-profit organizations.

He is life member of the VFW, Red River Valley Fighter Pilots Association, Military Order of Daedalians, Air Force Academy Sabre Society, and Knights of Columbus.

LOCAL HISTORY

No Easter Bunny, But a Baby Brother Instead!

Oral History of Ross Murphy

My sister Colleen was disappointed because she did not get an Easter bunny on Easter Sunday, April 9, 1939.

Instead of a bunny she got me, her little brother Ross Clay and I wasn't so little. I tipped the scales a little over 10 pounds. Dr. Jones came to my Grandmother Murphy's house to deliver me. Sometime after my birth in Comfort we moved to Kerrville.

We lived in Kerrville near the state hospital until my father was drafted into the army at age 36 when we returned to Comfort. We lived in an old house owned by Gilbert Melchor. When the corner house next door was offered for sale for \$1500, my parents bought it. They made small monthly payments until it was paid for.

My earliest memories are playing anti-over with Colleen and Randolph and Betty Jean Burlison. We played softball in the street with Carl Joe and George Raute. In our backyard we played with little cars, built tunnels, and made stick pens. We climbed trees and built forts. We quit playing at dark.

We took baths on Saturday night with water heated on the stove and poured into the bathtub. Colleen was first, then me, then Randolph, then our parents. A kettle of hot water was added as each person got their bath. We did not waste water.

When Papa came home from World War II where he was a cook, it took him a while to get a job he liked. For several years he worked for Mr. Dan T. Holekamp as a parts man. He had Saturday afternoons off. When he came home from work at noon on Saturday, he brought a pint of ice cream, three cream soda, and we all five shared this delicious treat. We went to Clasby's Café and each had a delicious hamburger, shared three bags of chips, and drank ice tea. Then it was off to the Comfort Theatre to see the movie of the week. We got to the movie midway through the film, so we stayed to see all the previews and the beginning of the movie. This time together was a weekly treat for all our family.

ROSS MURPHY LEARNED HOW TO WORK

The time came when Daddy asked for a \$10 raise from Mr. Holekamp to be added to his \$150 per month salary and was turned down. Mother and Daddy decided to go into business for themselves, borrowed money, and bought the Mobile Station from Richard Brough who was retiring. This small business improved our family's fortunes.

From little on, Mother helped me do lawn work. "You don't jus mow, you rake and trim," she admonished me. Every dime I make, I saved. Mother and Mrs. Goforth had high expectations for me to be a doctor. Unfortunately the sight of blood made me sick, so that dream went away.

In the 7th grade I set up bowling pins at the Comfort Bowling Alley beside Colleen, Juell Krauter and Marvin Toepfer. I worked 3 nights a week for 3 hours and earned \$1.05 plus a 6 cent Pepsi Cola. Each night. I did this job on through out 8th grade and saved this money also.

In 8th grade I took over August Faltin's newspaper route when he left for college. I used my bicycle for 6 days a week and my mother drove me on Sundays. Usually I cleared about \$50 per month that I saved. In 9th grade I bought August Faltin's old Wizard motorbike for \$50. Mother helped me during sports seasons. She enjoyed it. Next, I bought August Faltin's Indian motorcycle for \$200. Three years later I sold it to my cousin, Wayne Flach, for \$185.

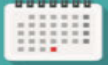
In addition to those jobs, I learned many skills at our service station, changed tires for 50 cents, got \$1.25 for a car wash, and filled gas tanks when gas was 20 cents a gallon. My parents accepted an offer to move to the Gulf Station on U.S. 87.

When they moved there they got an additional 5 cents a gallon for every gallon sold. They added some groceries for the public. (An early day convenience store) Daddy was asked to drive a school bus and Mother ran the station. Their examples probably contributed to my understanding that a strong work ethic was much to be desired.

Our social life centered on birthdays in the family. Mostly the men played blackjack and the women did needlework. Later we all feasted on homemade cakes, pies, coffeecake, cookies and coffee. The little kids played outside if the weather was nice and always ate last.

On Sundays we kids went to Sunday School and our parents joined us for church. Mother wore a hat on Communion Sundays, and she always carried a lacey handkerchief in her hand, never a purse.

Growing up in Comfort, Texas was a lot like growing up in Mayberry. My childhood gave me the support I needed to do well during high school, survive the National Guard, and graduate college. I always knew my parents loved me, my friends liked me, and that my teachers encouraged me. It was small town USA!

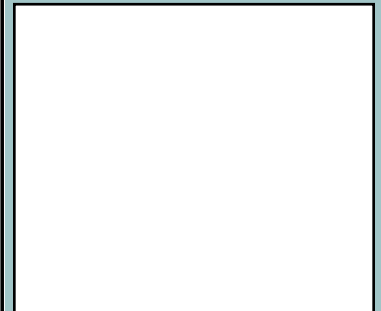
