The Norwell Council on Aging received an \$8,000 Service Incentive Grant from the Massachusetts Council on Aging to provide scholarships to assist with caregiver respite. Respite is important to give caregivers a chance to address their own emotional, social and physical needs and varies based on each individual. This program is open to qualifying Norwell residents. 

#### **NOTARY SERVICE**

Community Services Coordinator Dee

Dee Rogers, is a Notary. Documents needing notarizing should not be signed until the Notary reviews the documents and checks the photo ID of the person needing the notarization.

Please note that Chapter 222 section 17(e) of MA General Laws:

A notary public who is **not** an attorney licensed to practice law in the commonwealth shall not conduct a real estate closing and shall not act as a real estate closing agent, provided, however that a notary public who is employed by an attorney so licensed may notarize a document in conjunction with a real estate closing conducted by the attorney and a notary public who is employed by a lender may notarize a document in conjunction with the closing of such lender's real estate loans.

Additional Important Information Please know Council on Aging Notary Service is not available for wills, living wills, power of attorney, living trusts, codicils or depositions. Please call Dee Dee Rogers at the Council on Aging for a Notary Service appointment. 781-659-7878.

We provide transportation to medical appointments, grocery shopping and local prescription pick up. Please call the COA at 781-659-7878 for additional information or to schedule a ride.

- Riders must schedule a minimum of three
   (3) business days in advance. No Friday or weekend calls for Mondays.
- Our priority is medical appointments (doctor, PT and other procedures not involving sedation) and our service area includes Norwell, Hanover, Hingham, Weymouth, Cohasset, Scituate and some parts of Pembroke.
- Transportation is available Monday through Thursday for appointments with a start time between 9:00 a.m. and no later than 2:00 p.m. Appointments on Friday mornings between 9:00 and Noon, in Norwell and Hanover only.
- Riders must be ready at least 15 minutes before designated pickup time at home.
   Our schedules are tight and drivers cannot wait.
- Be sure to ask your medical provider about their waiting policy before and after your appointment.
- We understand that things can come up last minute. If same-day transportation can be accommodated we will provide it, but it is not guaranteed.
- There is currently no fee for our transportation.
- Masks are strongly encouraged while riding on our vans.
- Due to liability, we do not provide transportation for hospital, nursing home or rehab discharge or procedures involving sedation. In some cases, South Shore Community Action Council may be able to assist in this type of transportation. Please call us to inquire.






# Tues., May 2—The Story of Buffalo Bill—William F Cody: Buffalo Bill Center of the West Wil-



liam F Cody was a fascinating product of the American West. The complicated story of Cody's life and his exploits in the American West and later in performances depicting that "Wild West" will be examined using the Center's collections. George Miller presents this wonderful story spanning the mid to late 1800's to 1917, illuminating both the man and his times.

#### Tues., May 9—Anderson National Historic

**Site** Andersonville National Historic Site began as a stockade built about 18 months before the end of the U.S. Civil



War to hold up to 10,000 Union Army prisoners captured by Confederate soldiers. At its most crowded, it held more than 32,000 men, many of them wounded and starving, in horrific conditions with rampant disease, contaminated water, and only minimal shelter from the blazing sun and the chilling winter rain. In the prison's 14 months of existence, some 45,000 Union prisoners arrived here; of those, 12,920 died and were buried in a cemetery created just outside the prison walls. Andersonville is the deadliest ground of the Civil War. The program will begin with a general overview of Civil War prison statistics and why Andersonville was chosen as a location for a prison site., cover living conditions inside the prison, the experience of prison guards, and the efforts to preserve the site after the Civil War.

Tues., May 16—"Bravo" - National Portrait Gallery Florenz Ziegfeld orchestrating sequined spectaculars at the Follies to Elvis Presley shaking up the cultural landscape. The creative diversity of the American experience is remarkably expressed in the exuberance, elegance, and dynamism of its performing arts. "Bravo!" presents a vibrant showcase of the performers who brought these arts to life. Beginning in years when artists performed only live and without microphones, "Bravo!" covers the technological evolution that has made performance accessible at the click of a mouse.

Johnstown Flood National Memorial On Friday May 31, 1889, the South Fork

Dam failed, sending 20 million tons of water 14 miles down the Conemaugh Valley to Johnstown. The Johnstown Flood killed 2,209 people in one of the country's worst disasters. This program explores the causes and effects including the history of the South Fork Dam, the South Fork Fishing and Hunting Club who owned the dam in 1889, events on May 31, the large-scale recovery effort that followed.

Tues., June 6 —Homestead National Historic Park: "Homesteading, Women's Suffrage, and the Wizard of Oz"

This presentation explores the women's suffrage and homesteading themes in Frank L. Baum's, *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz.* The program highlights the ways

those themes remain prominent in retellings of the classic tale. It uses brief vocal music elements to demonstrate the many interpretations of this American fairytale; including, songs from the 1939 Judy Garland film: *The Wizard of Oz. Homesteading, Women's Suffrage, and the Wizard of Oz,* is an engaging program that explores the experiences that helped Baum shape his iconic story.

Tues., June 13—Return to the Elephant Sanctuary! Since 1995, The Elephant Sanctuary in Tennessee has provided elephants retired from performance and exhibition with a safe ref-



uge and the companionship of other elephants. The facility has grown from 110 acres to 3,060 acres and has provided sanctuary to 29 elephants, making it North America's largest natural habitat refuge for captive elephants.
