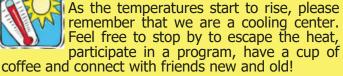
We are excited about all of the great programming that we have planned for the summer and even as we look towards the fall. We hope you will join us!

SOUTH SHORE HABITAT FOR HUMANITY CRITICAL HOME REPAIR

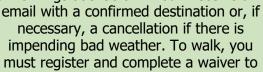

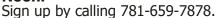

TRANSPORTATION

We provide transportation to medical appointments, grocery shopping and local prescription pick up. Please call the COA at 781-659-7878 for additional information or to schedule a ride.

- Riders must schedule a minimum of three
 (3) business days in advance. No Friday or weekend calls for Mondays.
- Our priority is medical appointments (doctor, PT and other procedures not involving sedation) and our service area includes Norwell, Hanover, Hingham, Weymouth, Cohasset, Scituate and some parts of Pembroke.
- Transportation is available Monday through Thursday for appointments with a start time between 9:00 a.m. and no later than 2:00 p.m. Appointments on Friday mornings between 9:00 and Noon, in Norwell and Hanover only.
- Riders must be ready at least 15 minutes before designated pickup time at home.
 Our schedules are tight and drivers cannot wait.
- Be sure to ask your medical provider about their waiting policy before and after your appointment.
- We understand that things can come up last minute. If same-day transportation can be accommodated we will provide it, but it is not guaranteed.
- There is currently no fee for our transportation.
- Masks are strongly encouraged while riding on our vans.
- Due to liability, we do not provide transportation for hospital, nursing home or rehab discharge or procedures involving sedation. In some cases, South Shore Community Action Council may be able to assist in this type of transportation. Please call us to inquire.

MAP Transportation

Transportation to Boston-area hospitals, VA hospitals or those rides we can't accommodate along the Route 3 corridor, are scheduled through South Shore Community Action Council. SUMMER SAFETY TIPS

Minimize Sun Exposure: During the summer season, avoid relying on just sunscreen to protect your child from excess sun exposure. Avoid mid-day sun when the sun's



rays are the strongest (10:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.). Cover up with light- weight clothing to protect the arms and legs. Wear a wide brimmed hat/ visor and wear UV sunglasses to protect the eyes. Have lots of bottled water on hand.

Note: Some medications make a person more susceptible to sunburn, so extra precautions are needed to avoid prolonged sun exposure.

Check with your doctor or pharmacist if you are not sure, as there are many more that can cause sensitivity when combined with sun exposure.



Heat safety: Young and elderly, overweight and people with chronic conditions can have problems with heat. Stay hydrated and drink plenty of fluids throughout the day. Water is the best choice, soda and caffeine drinks are poor choices. Try to avoid being outside

in the sun between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on the really hot days. The longer it is hot (heat waves of over 90 degrees) the more danger. Avoid strenuous activity during hot days. Watch extreme temperature changes, as when going from airconditioning to outside heat. Wear light colored clothing. Watch for signs of heat exhaustion: heavy sweating, severe thirst, weakness, headache, nausea and vomiting. Protect head and face with hat and wear sun- glasses! NEVER! Leave anyone in a parked car during a heat wave! This includes pets!

Lyme disease: From ticks - causes rash, fatigue, fever and flu like symptoms. Wear light colored clothing, use insect repellant with DEET, avoid grassy areas, perform daily tick checks on yourself and your children and promptly remove any ticks (save removed tick for MD). If you think you have been bitten – call your doctor.
